The goal was to better understand the needs and challenges faced by children and adolescents on the autism spectrum, as well as ways to address these difficulties using the Cognitive Behavioral Drama (CBD)* method.

goal, it gave us a hands-on understanding of how, through theatrical play, children or teens can be motivated and empowered to overcome difficulties and fears, develop communication channels, shared goals, and cooperation... dare to change thought and behavior patterns that hold them back.
